


"Can students teach each other, instead of having teachers?"

Acton Academy Kuala Lumpur had its roots in late 2014 when two friends tried to answer the above question by doing experiments. They learnt that children are far more capable than they imagined. An entire classroom with no teachers was possible, and every child was engaged. Could we scale this further?

It turns out that there was already a group of revolutionaries doing just that—Acton Academy. We applied in 2016 and became the first Acton Academy in Asia. Our goal: to create the ideal environment for own children. An environment that prepares them to be self-driven independent learners who will pursue a life of meaning for a future that is beyond our imagination.

Nigerian proverb "It takes a village to raise a child" rings touches us. In just a few years, we grew to serve a broader community of families. We invite you to join us in this grand adventure of creating that village. That ideal village where each of us are on a Hero's Journey to find a calling to change the world.



Our Promise to your Child


Through Socratic Guiding & Experiential Learning, he/she will:

Ages 4–7 | Spark Studio



Spark a unique, curious, and independent spirit.

The Spark Studio is a nurturing space where Eagles embark on a journey of discovery, exploration, and positive character traits.

- Montessori manipulatives build language and math skills.
- lndoor and outdoor loose parts and hands-on projects provide **play-based** learning opportunities.
- Studio life creates **habits of independence** through conflict resolution, studio clean-up, timekeeping, etc.

Ages 7-12 | Discovery Studio



Discover a deep love of learning and social interaction.

The Discovery Eagles own the studio space. They start the process of self-governance by creating and upholding a covenant.

- Personalized Core Skills self-paced reading, writing, math, and computer science. Build good learning habits.
- **Hands-on projects** provide exploration into the arts, sciences, history, and the natural world.
- Socratic discussions hone critical thinking skills. Townhall, studio responsibilities, and character badges cultivate leadership skills.

Age 11-15 | Adventure Studio

Work hard, develop real-world skills, and adventure out into the real world.

The Adventure Eagles run their studio. They face exciting opportunities and responsibilities by:

- Mastery-based reading, writing, math, and computer science. Eagles learn to calculate, write, and think more deeply.
- Work on difficult Quests, **real-world** simulations and ethical dilemmas.
- Eagles find their calling by exploring gifts, passions, and apprenticeships. They develop a positive self-identity surrounded by a supportive community.

Entry requirements: Complete the Onboarding Quest, a 40-hour self-paced challenge to demonstrate independence and get "onboarded" to Acton Academy.

Typical first Apprenticeships:

Eagles learn how to narrow their search for an apprenticeship and approach employers on their own.

They became burger assemblers, coffee shop baristas, cashiers, childcare support, industrial designers, electrical component assemblers, stage assistants, scriptwriters, etc.

Ages 15-18 | Launchpad Studio


Launch out into the world with a vision and a calling that could change the world.

Launchpadders get ready for real-world success by gaining valuable skills. They master them through apprenticeships, deliberate practice, and launching real start-ups, businesses, and projects.

- Margine They customize their **learning plans** to prepare for their Calling in the real-world.
- Apprenticeships increase in length and complexity. By the time a learner leaves Launchpad, they have a **portfolio** of real-world work to prove what they can do.
- Launchpadders surround themselves with **mentors** in the fields they are passionate about. The mentors' perspective provides clarity of vision about their Callings.

Mentors: World-class entrepreneurs, artists, scientists, and heroes. Anyone who engages their field with passion and mastery.




We measure progress and feedback in a variety of ways:

Accreditation & Qualifications



Acton Academy is accredited by the **International Association of Learner Driven Schools (IALDS).**

Acton Launchpad graduates receive an accredited US high school diploma. They also researched their Next Great Adventure — a list of stepping-stone apprenticeships, desired college, or a real-world adventure like starting a business. They adapt and take the qualifications necessary to serve their journey and calling.



Learning Exhibitions

At the end of each project session, Eagles organize **Public Learning Exhibitions** to showcase their work to the outside world. They also gather real-world feedback to reflect and pinpoint areas for improvement in the future.

Exhibitions include:

- Diagnosing medical cases for the Medical Biology Quest.
- An art exhibition and auction for the Art Quest.
- A chemistry quiz and big cookout for the Chemistry & Cooking Quest.

 Publishing online games for the Programming Quest.

 The Children's Business Fair for the Entrepreneurship Quest.

Calendar

We follow a US cycle with adjustments for the Malaysian public holidays. The school year starts in September each year, and end in July the following year.

Each academic year has three terms and each term has two sessions. So, each year consists of six sessions, and each session is six weeks long.

Fees

Adventure & above : RM9,500 per term


and a refundable deposit equal to one-term fees.




